

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q: I'm having technical issues with accessing and completing the GE Modules. Who can assist?

Q: I want to change my major, when can I do that?

- A: Students can change their major beginning in the fall semester through the Office of Records and Registration. However, we encourage you to attend the Advising and Registration session that matches the major you wish to pursue this fall semester.

Q: How do I know that I completed my GE advising modules?

- A: Check your Student Center to ensure that the GE advising hold is removed the following day.

Q: I have passed my AP exam, how will I know I will get college credit for the AP exam/s I passed?

- A: University = CSUF; College = College of Communications (CCOM), and major = 1 of the 4 majors offered in CCOM
