## NEW BUSINESS

**1. LPH - Post-Event  
Presentation: Resume  
Workshop**

LPH presented a recap of their Resume Workshop held on Monday, October 7th. Attendance was approximately 14 students. An ice breaker lead into the resume workshop where the students were shown examples of real resumes, giving them ideas about formatting and what experience they should be getting. CSUF's LPH was recognized for this event by the National Communication Association's social media for all LPH chapters.

**2. S.T.A.N.C.E. - Proposal:  
First Speaker Event  
(\$176.91)**

A move for the following allocation to be approved for \$176.91 by STANCE and PRSSA seconds. The proposal is for their first speaker event of the year without NSSLHA as a partner. The event will take place on October 24th at 7pm in the TSU. STANCE is expecting around 100 people to attend. Items to be purchased include Mediteranean food, Capri Suns, and Plates.

Questions:

How many attendees have been present for this event in the past?

Around 100.

Who is the speaker?

They are the director of a speech clinic and will speak about the work of speech language pathologists.

Are their internship opportunities at her clinic?

There are volunteer positions and there will be time to network.

**3. NSSLHA - Proposal:  
First Speaker Event  
(\$211.78)**

The speaker is Linda Pippert, the current president of the state governing body of speech therapists and audiologists. NSSLHA is expecting 120 people to attend the event, which has been advertised through social media, email, flyers, and word of mouth. Questions:

Representatives from several beauty and fashion brands like Urban Decay and Revolve will speak on the panel about the insights they have on the industry. Items to be purchased are sandwich platters (Costco).

Questions:

How many people are you expecting to attend?

60-70.

How do you make your connections regarding panelists?

Most connections have been passed down in the club for a long time, and our president is very good at networking.

Is this event open to all students?

Yes.

Will you be pushing membership at this event?

This event will take place after the membership deadline.

Discussion:

LPH stated that the brands they have attending are very impressive.
